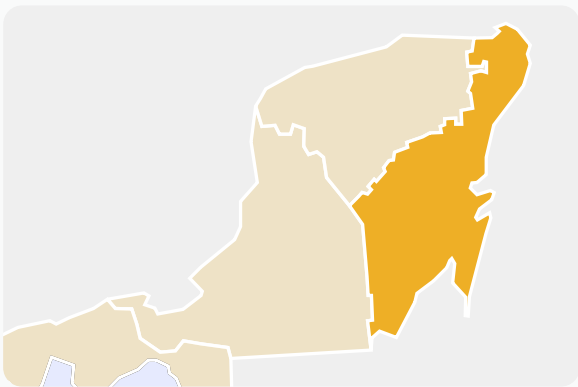
### Riviera Maya Jazz Festival

### Cancún Carnival

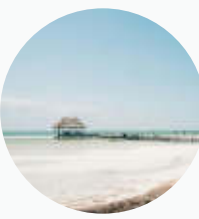
